how much time does all this take a day?

Well, it depends. For example, I just finished using my **Facemate ES-330** (my face looks great from the treatment) and it took a total of 30 minutes. Here is my routine:

Gather my hand mirror, conductivity gel, washcloth and **massanger** with power supply. Plug it in to a power supply I've got sitting under my loveseat and do a 20-minute session (5 minutes each quadrant of cheeks, forehead and neck). Then, I set it on the negative ion mode and use it 3 minutes each cheek and 2 minutes forehead and neck. I wash it off with a corner of the wet washcloth, dry it and then use the fully wet cloth to remove the gel from my face. I rinse once more and I'm done. It may sound like a lot but it's routine now so very quick and easy and I love what it does for my skin. This, BTW, is my shorter routine (I

do this once or twice during the week and a longer session one day on my weekend beauty day).

All of these are easy to do while watching TV - I normally catch up on my Discovery Channel so the time flies. I always use these gadget in front of the TV as it is way easier than in front of the bathroom mirror and I'm entertained at the same time. It's a breeze.

Hi stepfordwife - Okay the **Facemate ES-330** - In the cleansing mode, it must really cleanse well as I've had very few breakouts since I started using the **Facemate ES-330** and it gives my skin a nice glow after cleansing; the ultrasound mode seems to plump up my skin and don't know if it's due to a deeper hydration or if the ATP cells are regenerating collagen. I had a couple deeper blue veins on my forehead and they seem to be less noticeable due to a thicker skin; then I use the microcurrent mode to lift the skin and I see a slight lifting around the eyebrows. I use the LED with both the ultrasound and the microcurrent. I also use an aloe vera gel with actives in it on both the ultrasaound mode and microcurrent mode.

I haven't seen it do too much for age spots or lines around the eyes but the nasolabial lines are diminished. For the price, I'm very happy with it. Don't think any home gadget will do as well as a professional model. I am in my mid fifties so don't gulp yet – DiPhx

Hi stepfordwife - Yes I have used the **Facemate ES-330** on my jowls and neck. When you use the microcurrent mode, you have to be careful how you move the device. In looking up how other microcurrent devices are used, they are used in a lifting motion and not in circular motion. When you use upward strokes on the microcurrent, you have to move it in the right places to lift the jowls. and yes, I also use it on the neck - both the ultrasound and microcurrent. I use the 3mhz on face and neck and never go above the "5" level. haven't thought about using a mixture of aloe with regular lotion as the aloe dries rather quickly in the heat out here so I spritz water on the aloe when it dries. it may water down a cream if I have to spritz that mixture as well. I definitely think it is worth the investment - it makes my skin baby smooth too. Good luck! DiPhx

I would love to source an Ultrasound system that I can use for joint pain, facial firming and cellulite reduction (yeah, I know, I'm asking for the moon!). From what I understand, cellulite reduction can be achieved only by a machine that sends 2-3 MHz of ultrasound frequency. The at-home units I found below only send 1 MHz of frequency - which is suitable for facial

firming and/or pain reduction. Has anyone else come across a system that offers ultrasound frequencies above 1 MHz??

One that looks nice because it has a combination of features is **Facemate ES-330**.

- 1MHz Ultrasonic(Vibration: 1 million times/sec) Delivered by the larger disk. With the safe, special design of touched control panel, there are 8 intensities to induct ions deeply into any kind of skin. When without contact with skin at 5 seconds, the ultrasonic head will stop outputting wave (but the time is still running) avoiding any over heat and burnt out.

- 3MHz Ultrasonic (Vibration: 3 million times/sec) Delivered by the smaller disk. There are 8 intensities of inductions for inducting negative ions superficially into any kind of skin. Use 3MHz alternately with 1MHz, the effect can be enhanced.

- Negative ion

After using ultrasonic, inducting negative ion for 5 minutes can make skin softness and harmony

- Mixed wave micro current (good effect of removing furrow)

Use microwave to massage the face, it can activate cells, improve metabolism, hence extend the life cycle of cells and prevent furrow recurrence.

- High energy light (nano 660nm wave length)

Researches show that, when using low energy heliotherapy narrow wave length together with ultrasonic, the light wave with wave length of 480nm ~880nm can activate enzyme C in the cell, to create more energy to accelerate the combination of DNA & RNA to make collagen fiber or

motion fiber to eliminate the dead cells and impurities.

- Skin moisture test

It can test the skin if the skin is dry, average or moist. Moisturizer is recommended for dry skin while applying this device.
